Speaking of the FCA and upcoming conference, an


exciting update from the FCA came this month that on June 26th Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis signed into law House Bill 1063, legislation advanced by the FCA and approved by Florida's Legislature earlier this year. The new law, effective upon signing, confirms the scope of a procedure that many chiropractic physicians have been performing for many years – dry needling. It further provides that the Florida Board of Chiropractic Medicine is to promulgate a new rule to establish minimum standards for the performance of dry needling to include those requirements detailed in the bill. Stay tuned for FCA updates regarding a Dry Needling Foundations course that may be offered at the National this year. This is a huge advancement for our profession, so thank you for your support of our PAC and be sure to donate if you are able.




