A CSA (chiropractic service announcement) from Mark Z Lipkin DC

Did You Report your BOI to the FinCEN?

(more Acronyms! ...just what we needed)

Beginning January 1, 2024, business entities (including chiropractic practices) that meet certain criteria must file a Beneficial Ownership Information Report (BOI) to the U.S. Department of Treasury's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN). Its purpose is to identify individuals with at least 25% ownership interest or control of the company.

The purpose of this bipartisan Corporate Transparency Act (enacted in 2021) is to curb illicit finance, requires many companies doing business in the United States to report information about the individuals who ultimately own or control them.

One and Done: Beneficial ownership information reporting is not an annual requirement. A report only needs to be submitted once, unless the filer needs to update or correct information. No Fee: There is no fee for submitting your beneficial ownership information report to FinCEN. Delay and Pay: A business that fails to provide a full and accurate BOIR may face a civil penalty of up to \$500 per day.

FinCEN launched the BOI E-Filing website for reporting beneficial ownership information https://boiefiling.fincen.gov

A reporting company created or registered to do business before January 1, 2024, will have until January 1, 2025, to file its initial BOI report.

A reporting company created or registered in 2024 will have 90 calendar days to file after receiving actual or public notice that its creation or registration is effective.

Is a sole proprietorship a reporting company?

Yes, a sole proprietorship is Exempt:

An entity is a reporting company only if it was created (or, registered to do business) in the United States by filing such a document.

Filing a document with a government agency to obtain (1) an IRS employer identification number, (2) a fictitious business name, or (3) a professional or occupational license does not create a new entity, and therefore does not make a sole proprietorship filing such a document a reporting company.

For more information, consult FinCen.Gov or your financial professional.

BEWARE:

There are fraudulent attempts to solicit information from individuals and entities who may be subject to reporting requirements under the Corporate Transparency Act.

This fraudulent correspondence may be titled "Important Compliance Notice" and asks the recipient to click on a URL or to scan a QR code.

Those e-mails or letters are fraudulent. According to the FinCEN, it does not send unsolicited requests.

THE RADIOLOGIST'S VIEW



DID YOU REALLY MEAN THAT?

The practice of diagnostic radiology is monotonous. The repetitive cadence of the phraseology and the volume of images that are assessed in a typical day can result in the insatiable desire

to take a nap. To maintain focus, periodic mental breaks are required. This may consist of checking email, checking social media accounts, or just walking around the office in a zombie-like stupor in an attempt to awaken the

cortical cells that have gone numb. However, on occasion, the radiologist is treated to a case history that gets the blood accelerating due to the comical (albeit, non-intentional) nature of its contents. True examples follow:

The history indicates that the "patient denies surgery", but there is evidence of surgical fusion of the cervical spine with metal plates and screws. It is understandable that one may forget the splinter they got when they were a kid, but how does this happen!

A patient states that he has "no complaints at this time" and is "getting x-rays because the doctor wants me to". This might be considered therapeutic if ionizing radiation was good for us.

Medical history: "Low back pain and left growing pain". *Exactly what was growing?*

The referring doctor requests "Report on cervical views only please". The medical history states "Left knee pain". Which nerve is it again that travels from the cervical spine to the knee?

On the clinic's Health Questionnaire, the patient lists "doctor visit" under the heading "Additional Complaints". *This doesn't look good on a patient satisfaction survey.*

In describing the mechanism that caused the twisted ankle, the patient states "I twisted my ankle while walking in a hole" It must have been a fairly large hole. How did the patient get out of it?

The patient states that she has no recent history of trauma but says she "was a cheerleader and fell on head a lot." Maybe she should have tried out for the chess team.

The doctor asks to rule out a wrist fracture. History listed, "unremarkable". *Now that's a fragile person.*

What test would you order if the diagnosis was sleep apnea? Brain? Neck soft tissues? MRI requisition asks for "Right Tibia and Fibula". Looking for....?

The doctor orders an MRI of the lumbar spine without contrast with the history indicating "No low back pain. Patient is bad historian". *In other words, you* find yourself telling the patient that they have back pain and insist they just don't know it.

Patient presents to the imaging center for x-rays of her left hip. History on the requisition states, "pain while walking for years". No surprise here, walking for years can get painful.

Under the heading of previous surgeries the patient writes, "gold bladder removed 15 years ago". The patient must have thought she needed a gold bladder ever since she confused investing in gold for ingesting gold.

Sometimes a form is filled out in haste resulting in the outcomes described above. In most cases it is harmless, but there may be times when a more significant error results. The referring doctor must take care in preparing requisitions for imaging studies by being sure the test ordered is appropriate for the history. Even if the patient fills out part of the form, it is the doctor or the technologist that is responsible for the accuracy and clarity of the statements. As much as these errors make for a good mental break for the radiologist they can lead to inefficient or improper patient care.

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

Student Degree and Dry Needling

The full House gave its approval on final passage to one of the FCA's top initiatives this year, House Bill 1063 (Rep.Christine Hunschofsky, D-Parkland), by a vote of 114 to 1. The bill seeks to correct difficulties some DC students have experienced in getting licensed by having earned their undergraduate degree from colleges outside the U.S. The legislation also provides statutory clarification that dry needling procedures are within the scope of chiropractic for DCs practicing in Florida.

An amendment was adopted on the floor before the final vote conforming to the Senate version of the bill (SB 1474 by Senator Jay Trumbull, R-Panama City) awaiting The amendment added guidelines for education, training, and certification that DCs would be required to complete before performing the procedure. Senate gave its final approval as well and now the measure will head to the Governor's desk for his consideration. The effective date of the bill is upon becoming law. Thus, the bill would go into effect upon the Governor's signature.
